- Comm Specialist Councilwoman Pastor
- · Minimal 25k total budget for districts; Mayor's office 50k
- Speed bumps are inexpensive (about 1500/ea)
- Tree planting, bench in a park is also an option

Coronado Safety Concerns (Guest: Community Action Officer Ben Harris)

- · COA Ben Harris No show
- Natasha Jones has concerns
- Several streets do not have many speed bumps
- · Lots of drag racing, random gunshots
- Lots of issues between 16th 20th Streets
 - Parking issues on the South side of the street
 - Homicide within the last year
 - Speeding: bypassing other streets that have speed bumps and are coming down Oak St. No one is enforcing parking.
 - Helicopters are flying over almost every night
 - The neighborhood is at wits end
 - Lots of frustration with Officer Ben (unresponsive)
 - Neighbor called multiple times/never answered
 - Would like a different Community Action Officer
 - Non-emergency number is a good resource still
- Brenda mentioned that Officer Ben does show up to other neighborhood meetings such as Palm Croft, Encanto, North Encanto - this was her first meeting that she's been to where Ben has not been present
 - Just keep reporting issues/concerns for now
 - Solano is a problem area keeping the park active will help
 - Parking concerns can certainly be addressed

- Re-start the Block Watch, but we need people to help!
- What can we do to help support the neighborhood to help?
- Who can the neighborhood call for help?
- CNA be the point-of-contact and filter concerns to our Councilwoman?
